Chairman & Chief Executive Report

We are pleased to report that 2015 was a year of growth and year of reflection for the Canterbury-Bankstown Bulldogs.

2015 was the first year of the new Strategic Plan. The plan sets stretch goals and the organisation made excellent strides delivering to them. The plan requires a commitment to innovation across all areas of the business and on reflection, one year in, strong progress has been made. The business is positioned well to capitalise on the opportunities that will flow from an improved broadcast deal for the NRL from 2018 onwards.

Celebrating our 80th Anniversary provided an opportunity to celebrate all those who fostered the tremendous sense of family, the toughness and the resilience that have been the foundation of the Bulldogs and showcase our many successes over the years.

We are confident that decisions made and strategies implemented over the last few years, will ensure that the Bulldogs remain on track to thrive for at least another 80 years.

Key highlights for the 2015 year include:

- A cumulative television audience of more than 41,700,000 people, the Bulldogs became the most watched NSW based team for the 2014/15 seasons.
- For the fifth time in the past seven years, the Bulldogs finished with the highest average attendance for a Sydney Club
- Membership reached record levels - for the first time ever more than 18,000 people are members of the Bulldogs.
- There was more Sponsorship and Commercial Partnership revenue generated than ever before
- The Bulldog Belmore, the most innovative sporting retail and Café experience in Australia, opened in March and fast became a hub for Members and fans to gather and talk about their shared passion for the Club and to purchase the latest merchandise offerings.
- With 264,000 Facebook followers, 47,000 twitter followers and 65,000 Instagram followers the Bulldogs continued to feature as a leader amongst NRL Clubs on social media channels. #proudtobeabulldog was the fourth most used hashtag in Australian sport in 2015, beating the likes of #NRL, #AFL and #CWC15
- The Club hosted two sold out games at Belmore Sports Ground, the Bulldogs' spiritual home. With fans watching from trees outside the ground, players breaking into the team song on the field and the hill packed with families, a new generation of fans now share an appreciation for the tremendous sense of community and belonging that comes with being a part of the Bulldogs and Rugby League.
- More than 850 attended the Bulldogs Gala 80th anniversary dinner. It was an outstanding night for the Club as fans, Members, Club legends, players, sponsors and staff gathered to celebrate values that have nurtured so much success over the years. The night culminated with the naming of Eddie Burns, Les Johns, Dr George Peponis, Steve Mortimer and Terry Lamb as inaugural inductees into the Bulldogs Hall of Fame
- Nearly 4000 children were provided with an opportunity to join our Junior Rugby League thanks to the dedication of hundreds of volunteers and parents across the Canterbury Bankstown district
- In 2015 we added Brett Morris who joined his twin brother Josh at the Bulldogs. Sam Perrett re-signed for two years and we signed exciting young fullback Brad Abbey from the Warriors, as well as Will Hopoate from the Eels.
- We also wish Frank Pritchard and Trent Hodgkinson all the best for their new challenges and thank them for their contributions to the Bulldogs
- Bulldogs in the Community underwent significant expansion and the Club is now working with Canterbury, Bankstown and Liverpool councils to deliver health and wellness, social inclusion and violence prevention programmes to families and youth in the area.



2015 NRL Season Review

After returning to training in mid-November and off the back of a Grand Final loss in 2014, the playing squad returned for pre-season refreshed and hungry to go one better in 2015.

With only a couple of changes to the squad, Coach Des Hasler set about working with his squad and preparing them for the round one clash at the foot of the mountains, against the Penrith Panthers, with new recruits Brett Morris, Michael Lichaa and Curtis Rona representing the club for the first time. A late run brought some respect to the scoreline but ultimately a 24-18 loss was not the result the side were looking for. Round two saw the side find their groove and a victory over the Eels, followed by wins over the Sea-Eagles and Tigers, got the side traveling in the right direction.

Rounds 4-21 can best be described as a period where the side could not find any consistency, two or three victories were followed by the same amount of losses and a late charge to the finals was needed.

Throughout the State of Origin period the club had a number of representatives that hampered the side Hasler could select each week but with those players (Trent Hodkinson, Josh Jackson, David Klemmer, Brett Morris and Josh Morris) unavailable, it gave an opportunity to others with Herman Ese'ese, Danny Fualalo and Shaun Lane all the chance to make their NRL debuts throughout 2016.

With the side settled and the desire to qualify for the finals, the side went on a five-game winning streak from Rounds 22-26 with wins against the Broncos, Titans, Rabbitohs, Knights and Warriors to finish the season proper in fifth position on 32 points, with 14 wins and 10 losses.

Whilst many would say it was an inconsistent year, from the top 23 players at the club, 84 games in total were missed due to representative selection, injury or suspension throughout the season proper.

Week one of the Finals Series saw the side up against rivals St George Illawarra in an Elimination Final. For 60 minutes the Bulldogs looked comfortable but a late finish from the Dragons left scores level at the end of 80 minutes. A Josh Reynolds field goal broke the deadlock in the 84th minute and the Bulldogs lived to fight another day with an 11-10 victory.


Week two saw the side run into a hot Roosters side. The sides went toe-to-toe for 50 minutes but after a controversial try was awarded to Roosters prop Kane Evans, it gave the tri-colours the upper hand and they took the victory and with it the hopes of the Bulldogs, ending the season for the blue and whites.

Congratulations and thanks must go to the players who departed the club at season's end. Damien Cook, Trent Hodkinson, Antonio Kaufusi, Frank Pritchard and Corey Thompson all played different roles at the club but they are part of the Bulldogs family and we thank them for their service.

2015 NYC Season Review

After what was a disappointing 2014 for the NYC side, 2015 looked like taking a similar path with four straight losses to open the season but a relatively strong middle section put the young pups in a position to qualify for the finals but results didn't go their way, finishing in 10th position after 26 rounds.

There was a mixture of young talent and players that were back for their second or third year, with names like Royce Hunt, Jake Kamire, Brad Keighran, Brandon Luamanu, Darcy Maroske, Michael Morgan, Alex Sorge and Renouf To'omaga the young men who would take on a leadership position in the squad.

It was a season where the side really struggled to find any consistency with no more than two victories in a row able to be put together at any one time.

The start of the season was a real struggle with defence being the major concern for Coach Scott Murray. With over 30 points leaked in each of the opening four matches, it was something that needed to change quickly. Upon reflection, the round five first half against the Rabbitohs will probably go down as one of the best halves of football for the season.

By mid-season it wasn't looking great for the side with five wins and seven losses registered but with a mixture of injuries and a number of players taking a little longer to be 'match fit', the squad knew the run into the back end of the season would be a lot better. Back rower and 2014 player of the year Renouf To'omaga missed the entire pre-season after recovering from off-season surgery whilst Harry Pondakas arrived late in the pre-season and took a while to become accustomed to the style of play.

A gutsy one-point win over the Melbourne Storm at Belmore and a strong performance against the Sharks in Round 20 gave the side a base leading into the closing rounds but without wins against the sides that were above them on the ladder, it was all too late for the team to scrape into the top eight.

Lock forward Darcy Maroske was awarded the Hazem El Masri 'NYC Player of the Year' Award after playing in every match of the year and being consistent in every performance.

Congratulations must also go to Renouf To'omaga who represented the Junior Kiwis for the second year in a row in the annual match against the Junior Kangaroos.

Whilst some players have departed the club with their career path now headed in another direction, a total of seven players have made the step up into the full-time training squad in preparation for season 2016.

The past two seasons has not seen any finals football played but one positive to come out of the NYC side has been the development of individuals. Over the past three seasons, six players (Herman Ese'ese, Danny Fualalo, Shaun Lane, Moses Mbye, Lloyd Perrett and Tyrone Phillips) have gone on to make their NRL debut after coming through the system and playing in the NYC. Everyone at the club is hopeful that this trend continues, with some promising players coming through the system.

2015 Membership Review

The 2015 season was a successful one from a Membership perspective, with a significant growth in Membership numbers and revenue.

As well as retaining 76% of 2014 Members, an additional 6,685 new Members were welcomed on board. Income from Memberships totaled \$1.96m (ex GST) for the year.

In 2015 the Bulldogs continued to grow the number of flexible, supporter and regional options again, further emphasising that Membership is simply not a Season Ticket to home matches, but a personalised way for all passionate fans to actively invest and engage in the Club well above a general supporter level. There were 4,012 Members in 2015 who signed up to a package with less than three game access entitlements.

Our strategy to continue to grow our interstate and international markets saw a high take up of our ACT, Victorian, Queensland, Western Australian and New Zealand packages, over 2,000 Memberships in total. We successfully held or participated in Member events in all these regions as well as Gosford, Newcastle and Townsville.

The program reached 18,224 Members, the first time the 18,000 mark had been reached in the Club's history. This was a 20% increase from 2014 and was the 8th successive year of significant growth. This puts us on a path to aim for 25,000 Members by 2018, as per our Strategic Plan and to help support the NRL's game-wide strategy of 400,000 Members by 2017.

There has been a 50% increase in Membership revenue generated over the 2011-2015 five year period and we will aim to continue to increase this to be invested back into the Club.

Membership community engagement and increasing the variety of member events, continues to be a focus for the Club. Member events ranged from the postponed Members' Christmas party in January, first year Member welcome, Member day in July, inaugural Members trivia night and Junior Members clinic. In addition, Platinum Plus Members attended an exclusive pre-Member Day function as well as a special Belmore tour.



In accordance with the Constitution of the Company, every member of the Company undertakes to contribute an amount limited to \$10 per member in the event of the winding up of the Company during the time that he or she is a member or within one year thereafter. Total amount that members are liable as at 31 October 2015 is \$10,270 (2014: \$10,680).

7 Likely future developments

During the forthcoming year, the consolidated entity will continue to develop the Belmore premises in accordance with its Masterplan.

There has not arisen in the interval between the end of the financial period and the date of this report any other item, transaction or event of a material and unusual nature likely, in the opinion of the directors of the Company, to affect significantly the operations of the Company and the consolidated entity, the results of those operations, or the state of affairs of the Company and the consolidated entity.

Notes to the financial statements

For the year ended 31 October 2015

1 REPORTING ENTITY

Bulldogs Rugby League Club Limited (the Company) is a company incorporated and domiciled in Australia. The consolidated financial statements of the Company as at and for the year ended 31 October 2015 comprise the Company and its controlled entity (together referred to as the 'consolidated entity' and individually as 'Group entity').

The Company is a company limited by guarantee and without share capital. In accordance with the Constitution of the Company, every member of the Company undertakes to contribute an amount limited to \$10 per member in the event of the winding up of the Company during the time that he or she is a member or within one year thereafter.

The consolidated entity is a not-for-profit entity and is primarily involved in the operation of registered clubs and the promotion of rugby league.

2 BASIS OF PREPARATION

(a) Statement of compliance

In the opinion of the directors, the consolidated entity and the Company are not publicly accountable. The financial statements of the consolidated entity and the Company are Tier 2 general purpose financial statements which have been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards - Reduced Disclosure Requirements (AASBRDRs) adopted by the Australian Accounting Standards Board (AASB) and the Corporations Act 2001. These financial statements comply with Australian Accounting Standards - Reduced Disclosure Requirements.

ASIC Class Order 10/654 Inclusion of parent entity financial statements in financial reports has been applied to permit the inclusion of parent entity financial statements in this consolidated financial report.

The financial statements were approved by the Board of Directors on 16th December 2015.

(b) Basis of measurement

These consolidated financial statements have been prepared on the historical cost basis, except for investment property which is measured at fair value.

(c) Functional and presentation currency

These consolidated financial statements are presented in Australian dollars, which is also the Company's functional currency.

(d) Use of estimates and judgements

The preparation of financial statements requires management to make judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the application of accounting policies and the reported amounts of assets, liabilities, income and expenses. Actual results may differ from these estimates.

Estimates and underlying assumptions are reviewed on an ongoing basis. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognised in the period in which the estimate is revised and in any future periods affected.

Information about assumptions and estimation uncertainties that have a significant risk of resulting in a material adjustment within the next financial year are included in the following notes:

2 BASIS OF PREPARATION (continued)

(e) Going concern

The financial statements have been prepared on the going concern basis of accounting, which assumes the continuity of normal business activities and the realisation of assets and settlement of liabilities in the ordinary course of business.

The Company has reported a net working capital deficiency of \$910,422 (2014: \$1,158,688). Notwithstanding the above, the directors believe the going concern assumption is appropriate given:

- The Canterbury League Club Limited has committed grant funding for the year ending 31 October 2016 of \$5,150,000;
- In addition to the committed funding above, the Canterbury League Club Limited has undertaken to continue to provide such financial and other support as necessary (including grants or loans) to the Company for at least the next twelve months from the date of approval of the Company's financial statements for the year ended 31 October 2015 to enable the Company to continue to trade and to meet its financial obligations and be able to pay its debts as and when they become due and payable.

After considering the above, the directors consider that the Company will be able to continue to fulfil all obligations as and when they fall due for the foreseeable future, being at least one year from the date of approval of these financial statements, and accordingly, that the Company's financial statements should be prepared on a going concern basis.

3 SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The accounting policies set out below have been applied consistently to all periods presented in these consolidated financial statements, and have been applied consistently by the consolidated entity and the Company.

(a) Basis of consolidation

(i) Subsidiaries

Subsidiaries are entities controlled by the consolidated entity. Control exists when the consolidated entity has the power to govern the financial and operating policies of an entity so as to obtain benefits from its activities. In assessing control, potential voting rights that currently are exercisable are taken into account. The financial statements of subsidiaries are included in the consolidated financial statements from the date that control commences until the date that control ceases. The accounting policies of subsidiaries have been changed when necessary to align them with the policies adopted by the consolidated entity.

(ii) Transactions eliminated on consolidation

Intra-group balances, and any unrealised income and expenses arising from intra-group transactions, are eliminated in preparing the consolidated financial statements.

(iii) Amalgamation reserve

An amalgamation reserve in members' funds is utilised for amalgamations with other registered clubs. The amount presented is equal to the fair value of the net assets of the club acquired. The individual assets and liabilities acquired are presented in the consolidated statement of financial position. This policy is effective for amalgamations occurring after 1 November 2010.

(b) Financial instruments

(i) Non-derivative financial assets

Financial assets are recognised initially on the date at which the consolidated entity becomes a party to the contractual provisions of the instrument.

The consolidated entity derecognises a financial asset when the contractual rights to the cash flows from the asset expire, or it transfers the rights to receive the contractual cash flows on the financial asset in a transaction in which substantially all the risks and rewards of ownership of the financial asset are transferred. Any interest in transferred financial assets that is created or retained by the consolidated entity is recognised as a separate asset or liability.

The consolidated entity has the following categories of non-derivative financial assets: loans and receivables.

Loans and receivables

Loans and receivables are recognised initially at fair value and subsequently measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method, less any impairment losses (see note 3(h)).

Loans and receivables comprise cash and trade and other receivables and call deposits with maturities greater than three months from the acquisition date that are subject to an insignificant risk of changes in their fair value.

Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents comprise cash balances and call deposits with maturities of three months or less from the acquisition date that are subject to an insignificant risk of changes in their fair value, and are used by the consolidated entity in the management of its short-term commitments.

(ii) Non-derivative financial liabilities

Financial liabilities are recognised initially on the date at which the consolidated entity becomes a party to the contractual provisions of the instrument. The consolidated entity derecognises a financial liability when its contractual obligations are discharged, cancelled or expire.

Financial assets and financial liabilities are offset and the net amount presented in the statement of financial position when, and only when, the consolidated entity has a legal right to offset the amounts and intends either to settle on a net basis or to realise the asset and settle the liability simultaneously.

The consolidated entity has the following categories of non-derivative financial liabilities: other financial liabilities.

Other financial liabilities are recognised initially at fair value plus any directly attributable transaction costs. Subsequent to initial recognition these financial liabilities are measured at amortised cost using the effective interest rate method.

Other financial liabilities comprise bank overdrafts, loans and borrowings and trade and other payables.

Bank overdrafts that are repayable on demand and form an integral part of the consolidated entity's cash management are included as a component of cash and cash equivalents for the purpose of the statement of cash flows.

(c) Property, plant and equipment

(i) Recognition and measurement

Items of property, plant and equipment are measured at cost less accumulated depreciation and accumulated impairment losses.

Cost includes expenditure that is directly attributable to the acquisition of the asset. Purchased software that is integral to the functionality of the related equipment is capitalised as part of that equipment.

When parts of an item of property, plant and equipment have different useful lives, they are accounted for as separate items (major components) of property, plant and equipment.

Any gains and losses on disposal of an item of property, plant and equipment (calculated as the difference between the net proceeds from disposal and the carrying amount of the item) is recognised in profit or loss.

(ii) Subsequent costs

Subsequent expenditure is capitalised only when it is probable that the future economic benefits associated with the expenditure will flow to the consolidated entity. Ongoing repairs and maintenance are expensed as incurred.

(c) Property, plant and equipment (continued)

(iii) Depreciation

Depreciation is calculated over the depreciable amount, which is the cost of an asset, or other amount substituted for cost, less its residual value.

Depreciation is recognised in profit or loss over the estimated useful lives of each part of an item of property, plant and equipment, since this most closely reflects the expected pattern of consumption of the future economic benefits embodied in the asset. Leased assets are depreciated over the shorter of the lease term and their useful lives unless it is reasonably certain that the consolidated entity will obtain ownership by the end of the lease term. Land is not depreciated.

The depreciation methods and estimated depreciation rates for the current and comparative periods are as follows:

Depreciation methods, useful lives and residual values are reviewed at each financial year-end and adjusted if appropriate.

(d) Intangible assets

Poker machine entitlements

Poker machine entitlements have infinite useful lives given they have no expiry date. They are measured at cost less accumulated impairment losses.

Subsequent expenditure is capitalised only when it increases the future economic benefits embodied in the specific asset to which it relates. All other expenditure is recognised in profit or loss as incurred.

(e) Investment property

Investment property is property held either to earn rental income or for capital appreciation or for both, but not for sale in the ordinary course of business, use in the production or supply of goods or services or for administrative purposes. Investment property is measured at cost on initial recognition and subsequently at fair value with any change therein recognised in profit or loss. Cost includes expenditure that is directly attributable to the acquisition of the investment property.

When the use of a property changes such that it is reclassified as property, plant and equipment, its fair value at the date of reclassification becomes its cost for subsequent accounting.

(f) Leased assets

Leases in terms of which the consolidated entity assumes substantially all the risks and rewards of ownership are classified as finance leases. Upon initial recognition the leased asset is measured at an amount equal to the lower of its fair value and the present value of the minimum lease payments. Subsequent to initial recognition, the asset is accounted for in accordance with the accounting policy applicable to that asset.

Other leases are classified as operating leases and the leased assets are not recognised in the consolidated entity's statement of financial position.

(g) Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value. The cost of inventories is based on the first in first-out principle, and includes expenditure incurred in acquiring the inventories and other costs incurred in bringing them to their existing location and condition.

Net realisable value is the estimated selling price in the ordinary course of business, less the estimated costs of completion and selling expenses.

(h) Impairment

(i) Financial assets

A financial asset not carried at fair value through profit or loss is assessed at each reporting date to determine whether there is objective evidence that it is impaired. A financial asset is impaired if objective evidence indicates that a loss event has occurred after the initial recognition of the asset, and that the loss event had a negative effect on the estimated future cash flows of that asset that can be estimated reliably.

Objective evidence that financial assets are impaired can include default or delinquency by a debtor, restructuring of an amount due to the consolidated entity on terms that the consolidated entity would not consider otherwise, indications that a debtor or issuer will enter bankruptcy, economic conditions that correlate with defaults.

The consolidated entity considers evidence of impairment for receivables at both a specific asset and collective level. All individually significant receivables are assessed for specific impairment. All individually significant receivables found not to be specifically impaired are then collectively assessed for any impairment that has been incurred but not yet identified.

An impairment loss in respect of a financial asset measured at amortised cost is calculated as the difference between its carrying amount and the present value of the estimated future cash flows discounted at the asset's original effective interest rate. Losses are recognised in profit or loss and reflected in an allowance account against receivables. Interest on the impaired asset continues to be recognised through the unwinding of the discount. When a subsequent event causes the amount of impairment loss to decrease, the decrease in impairment loss is reversed through profit or loss.

(i) Non-financial assets

The carrying amounts of the consolidated entity's non-financial assets, other than investment property, inventories and deferred tax assets, are reviewed at each reporting date to determine whether there is any indication of impairment. If any such indication exists, then the asset's recoverable amount is estimated. Indefinite live intangible assets are tested annually for impairment.

The recoverable amount of an asset or cash-generating unit is the greater of its fair value less costs to sell and value in use, being the depreciated replacement cost of the asset. For the purpose of impairment testing, assets are grouped together into the smallest group of assets that generates cash inflows from continuing use that are largely independent of the cash inflows of other assets or groups of assets (a "cash-generating unit" or "CGU").

An impairment loss is recognised if the carrying amount of an asset or its CGU exceeds its estimated recoverable amount. Impairment losses are recognised in profit or loss. Impairment losses recognised in respect of CGUs are allocated to reduce the carrying amounts of the other assets in the unit (group of units) on a pro rata basis.

Impairment losses recognised in prior periods are assessed at each reporting date for any indications that the loss has decreased or no longer exists. An impairment loss is reversed if there has been a change in the estimates used to determine the recoverable amount. An impairment loss is reversed only to the extent that the asset's carrying amount does not exceed the carrying amount that would have been determined, net of depreciation or amortisation, if no impairment loss had been recognised.

(i) Non-current assets held for sale

Non-current assets that are expected to be recovered primarily through sale rather than through continuing use are classified as held for sale. Immediately before classification as held for sale, the assets are remeasured in accordance with the consolidated entity's accounting policies. Thereafter generally the assets are measured at the lower of their carrying amount and fair value less cost to sell.

Impairment losses on initial classification as held for sale and subsequent gains or losses on remeasurement are recognised in profit or loss. Gains are not recognised in excess of any cumulative impairment loss.

Once classified as held for sale, intangible assets and property, plant and equipment are not amortised or depreciated.

(j) Employee benefits

(i) Defined contribution plans

A defined contribution plan is a post-employment benefit plan under which an entity pays fixed contributions into a separate entity and will have no legal or constructive obligation to pay further amounts. Obligations for contributions to defined contribution plans are recognised as an employee benefit expense in profit or loss in the periods during which services are rendered by employees.

(ii) Other long-term employee benefits

The consolidated entity's net obligation in respect of long-term employee benefits other than defined benefit plans is the amount of future benefit that employees have earned in return for their service in the current and prior periods plus related on-costs; that benefit is discounted to determine its present value, and the fair value of any related assets is deducted. The discount rate is the yield at the reporting date on government bonds that have maturity dates approximating the terms of the consolidated entity's obligations.

(iii) Short-term benefits

Short-term employee benefit obligations are measured on an undiscounted basis and are expensed as the related service is provided.

(k) Provisions

A provision is recognised if, as a result of a past event, the consolidated entity has a present legal or constructive obligation that can be estimated reliably, and it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will be required to settle the obligation. Provisions are determined by discounting the expected future cash flows at a pre-tax rate that reflects current market assessments of the time value of money and the risks specific to the liability.

The consolidated entity operates a loyalty program where customers accumulate points for dollars spent. The provision represents the current estimate of future cash outflows that will result from future redemption of unredeemed points as at year end.

Make good provision

In accordance with the consolidated entity's leases of premises, the consolidated entity must restore leased premises to their original condition. Because of the long-term nature of the liability, the greatest uncertainty in estimating the provision is the costs that will ultimately be incurred.

The provision is the best estimate of the present value of the expenditure required to settle the make good obligation at the reporting date, based on current market conditions. Future restoration costs are reviewed annually and any changes are reflected in the present value of the make good provision at the end of the reporting period.

(l) Revenue

Goods sold and services rendered

Revenue from the sale of goods comprises revenue earned from the provision of food, beverage and other goods, and is recognised when the significant risks and rewards of ownership have been transferred to the buyer. Revenue from services rendered comprises revenue from gaming facilities together with other services provided to members and patrons of the consolidated entity, and is recognised through profit or loss when the services are provided. No revenue is recognised if there are significant uncertainties regarding recovery of the consideration due or the reliable measurement of costs incurred or to be incurred, there is risk of return of goods or there is continuing management involvement with the goods.

Commissions

When the consolidated entity acts in the capacity of an agent rather than as the principal in a transaction, the revenue recognised is the net amount of commission made by the consolidated entity.

Grant revenue

Grants are recognised as income when there is reasonable assurance they will be received by the Company and the Company has complied with the conditions associated with the grant.

(m) Lease payments

Payments made under operating leases are recognised in profit or loss on a straight-line basis over the term of the lease. Lease incentives received are recognised as an integral part of the total lease expense, over the term of the lease.

Minimum lease payments made under finance leases are apportioned between the finance expense and the reduction of the outstanding liability. The finance expense is allocated to each period during the lease term so as to produce a constant periodic rate of interest on the remaining balance of the liability.

(n) Finance income and finance costs

Finance income comprises interest income on cash and cash equivalents. Interest income is recognised as it accrues in profit or loss, using the effective interest method.

Finance costs comprise interest expense on loans and borrowings. Borrowing costs that are not directly attributable to the acquisition, construction or productions of a qualifying asset are recognised in profit or loss using the effective interest method.

(o) Tax

(i) Company

The Company is exempt from income tax under Taxation Ruling 97/22 as the Bulldogs Rugby League Club Limited is regarded as being established for the encouragement of a game and sport.

(ii) Consolidated entity

a) Current tax

Current tax is the expected tax payable or receivable on the taxable income or loss for the year, using tax rates enacted or substantively enacted at the reporting date, and any adjustment to tax payable in respect of previous years.

b) Deferred tax

Deferred tax is recognised in respect of temporary differences between the carrying amounts of assets and liabilities for financial reporting purposes and the amounts used for taxation purposes.

The measurement of deferred tax reflects the tax consequences that could follow the manner in which the consolidated entity expects, at the end of the reporting period, to recover or settle the carrying amount of its assets and liabilities.

Deferred tax is measured at the tax rates that are expected to be applied to temporary differences when they reverse, using tax rates enacted or substantively enacted by the reporting date.

Deferred tax assets and liabilities are offset if there is a legally enforceable right to offset current tax liabilities and assets, and they relate to income taxes levied by the same tax authority on the same taxable entity, or on different tax entities, but they intend to settle current tax liabilities and assets on a net basis or their tax assets and liabilities will be realised simultaneously.

A deferred tax asset is recognised for unused tax losses, tax credits and deductible temporary differences, to the extent that it is probable that future taxable profits will be available against which they can be utilised. Deferred tax assets are reviewed at each reporting date and are reduced to the extent that it is no longer probable that the related tax benefit will be realised.

c) Tax exposure

In determining the amount of current and deferred tax the consolidated entity takes into account the impact of uncertain tax positions and whether additional taxes and interest may be due. This assessment relies on estimates and assumptions and may involve a series of judgements about future events. New information may become available that causes the consolidated entity to change its judgement regarding the adequacy of existing tax liabilities; such changes to tax liabilities will impact tax expense in the period that such a determination is made.

(p) Goods and services tax

Revenue, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST), except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the taxation authority. In these circumstances, the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of the expense.

Receivables and payables are stated with the amount of GST included. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the Australian Taxation Office (ATO) is included as a current asset or liability in the statement of financial position.

Cash flows are included in the statement of cash flows on a gross basis. The GST components of cash flows arising from investing and financing activities which are recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO are classified as operating cash flows.

8 DISCOUNTED OPERATIONS

In the prior year an offer of \$6,000,000 was received and accepted by the Company to de-amalgamate Bay Sports Club. The consideration was for the land, buildings, plant, equipment, gaming machine entitlements and employee benefits of the Bay Sports Club, accordingly the assets and liabilities to be transferred on the de-amalgamation had been presented as a disposal group held for sale at 31 October 2014. During the year Bay Sports Club was successfully de-amalgamated and the Company received \$5,000,000 as a first instalment, with the remaining \$1,000,000 to be received in FY16. This has been classified as a receivable in Other Receivables. Furthermore, at 31 October 2014 management had estimated, and recorded against the asset held for sale, costs of disposal of approximately \$500,000 relating to stamp duty and legal fees. These costs were not required to be paid upon the de-amalgamation and as such were reversed during the year as a gain on disposal.

In prior year, the land and buildings at the Earlwood premises had also been held for sale given the Earlwood premises ceased trading in 2014, the club's licence de-activated and all gaming machine entitlements transferred to other premises run by the Company. The Earlwood premises were sold during the year for a total consideration of \$6,570,694 and a net gain of \$179,438, after accounting for the write off of assets located at the Earlwood premises.

e) Certain players of the Company have paid rent amounting to \$42,596 (2014: \$42,855) to the controlled entity. All transactions have been executed at commercial rates. Furthermore, additional property was provided to certain junior players by the controlled entity free of charge.

f) The Company operates a Teamstore in a property owned by Canterbury League Club Limited located at Burwood Road, Belmore. Total rent paid to the controlled entity for the year amounts to \$52,000 (2014: \$17,000).

g) During the 2015 financial year, the Company reimbursed the controlled entity for costs incurred for fit-outs in the Team Store amounting to \$95,000.

h) At year end, an amount of \$2,733 (2014: \$54,293) was payable to the controlling entity and no amount was receivable from the controlling entity (2014: \$310,000).
